Privacy Policy

The New Hampshire Psychological Association (NHPA) is dedicated to protecting the personal information of our members and website visitors. This policy outlines our approach to managing your information and your consent to its collection and use. By visiting our website, you are agreeing to the collection and use of information in accordance with this Policy.

Usage Data

NHPA collects usage data, including but not limited to IP addresses, browser details, and visit specifics, to improve service. This data helps us understand how our site is used and can include detailed device information, particularly for mobile access.

Tracking Technologies and Cookies

We employ cookies and similar technologies for site functionality and to enhance user experience. You may control cookie settings in your browser, but this may affect website functionality. Our use of session and persistent cookies is to ensure website operability and remember user preferences. Session Cookies are essential to provide you with services available through the website and to enable you to use some of its features, while persistent cookies allow us to remember choices you make, such as your login details.

Personal Data

NHPA only gathers personal information like names or email addresses when provided by you, typically through emails or contact forms. Such information is used for responding to inquiries, service provision, and informing you of updates or events. We're committed to the accuracy and security of your data and adhere to strict protocols to safeguard it, including not sharing it without consent. Personal information that is shared via email will be communicated to office personnel (e.g., administrative assistant, webmaster, board members) who require this information to respond to inquiries.

NHPA does collect personal information that is necessary for the provision of certain services (e.g., attendance at a continuing education event, placing an advertisement) and for processing membership applications. Personal information may also be used to contact you regarding updates or to provide you with news, offers, and general information about events unless you have opted not to receive such information. We may also use personal information for data analysis, identifying usage trends, and to improve our services and your experience.

NHPA protects personal information in a manner that is appropriate for the sensitivity of that information. We make every reasonable effort to prevent any loss,

disclosure, or modification of personal information, as well as any unauthorized access to personal information. We do not share your personal information with anyone outside of NHPA unless we have obtained your consent.

Your Rights

You have the right to delete or request that we assist in deleting the personal data that NHPA has collected about you. You may update, amend, or delete your membership information at any time by signing into your account and visiting the account settings section that allows you to manage your personal information. You may also contact NHPA to request access to, correct, or delete any personal information that you have provided to us. Please note, however, that NHPA may need to retain certain information when we have a legal obligation or lawful basis to do so.
