Mandated Child Abuse Reporting Law Immunities: Are Professionals Really Protected?

Child abuse reporting laws have been in place for some 50 years. Typical state statutes mandate reports by mental health professionals, impose penalties for failure to report, and provide immunity from liability for mandated reporters. These requirements and protections notwithstanding, mandated reporters can still encounter risks of complaints and suits when fulfilling their statutory obligations.
